Dear Sir / Madam:

The Iowa Transportation Coordination Council is seeking your input to further coordination efforts in Iowa. We are asking for each health or human service provider in Iowa, whether public, private-not-for-profit, or private-for-profit to participate in a survey to help us better understand the services you provide and the structure of your organization.

We are also sending a survey to known passenger transportation providers based on lists obtained from local Regional Planning Affiliations or Metropolitan Planning Organizations, as well as from state agencies that are members of the Council.

The results of the surveys will be reviewed at an upcoming regional transportation workshop we are calling "Mobility Action Planning Workshops". The Council is sponsoring 15 workshops across Iowa that will serve as a foundation for an action plan and future coordination efforts as the state works toward a statewide plan.

Persons interested in improving transportation services will be working together to identify transportation needs, barriers, and potential resources. A local transportation advisory group will be established from volunteers willing to continue to work together to improve transportation services.
